### National Farmworkers Jobs Program

Presented by Janette Flores

- Focuses on connecting farmworkers (FW)/ agricultural workers and youth who are dependents of farmworkers to support services for workforce training and technical school.
- Question- Does working in agriculture means they need to touch produce?
  - It is dependent on the program, but some qualify without a need to touch produce.
- Eligibility is dependent on the training program and participant receiving services or their household.
  - Enrollment is open until July 2023 & it renew years in July
  - Need a form of documentation
    - \*18 yr. old who doesn't work can qualify as a dependent of FW or agri. worker.
    - some work/training is paid
    - DACA eligible for program
    - Age range of participants: 14-24

### Housing and Financial Services

presented by Ana Torres

- These services are available for families facing financial hardship to assist with basic housing needs.
- There are various programs that different guidelines for the different funding sources.
- An intake is begun to connect people to what services would benefit their households' needs.
  - Rental Assistance is provided through Yakima County program after eligibility is determined.
  - Mortgage program is available to help households needing help and it is specific to their needs.
  - Energy efficiency program available to protect heating and cooling in the homes. Eligibility determined by residents of home and approval of property owner.
  - OIC will reach out to other services when needed.
- Questions

- How long does the process take?
  - It depends on how soon the household can return the paperwork needed.
  - Intake application will be sent out or can be picked up in office. Once eligibility is established, then it will take 6-8 weeks for payment to be sent.
  - Emergency slots daily but need to be eligible for services for those facing eviction and utility shut-offs.
    - They will contact the vendor and promise payment to get services reconnected.
- Immigration status is not a deterrent for services available so full Intake will be done and eligibility determined.
- Eligibility based on income and need to be under 200% poverty level standard.
  - Determined by the income for last 3 months & encourage them to update when their situation changes and will reassess for the eligible programs and offer for all services available
- The different funding programs are specific to different services areas.
  - Many programs focused on upper Yakima.
  - Lower valley resources for similar program can be found through YVFWC NCAC services.

### Highschool Equivalency Program

Presented by Youth Program Instructor

- This program provides support services for adult learners who are working and support their families.
  - Non-traditional classrooms.
  - Ages 16+
  - Initial testing to determine eligibility or refer to best services.
  - English and Spanish services
  - Individual tutor assigned after acceptance to the program to specialize on participants time restrictions and needs.
- GED
  - GED is remodeled in 2014 and is more difficult than before
  - Remote testing space available at OIC; all testing is online.
  - 4 tests need to be passed to get GED certification.
- Volunteers in assisting with program can connect with OIC for more information.

**Debrief:**

- OIC overview
  - OIC programs come from different funding sources so each has their own eligibility requirements.
  - Seeks to help ppl to get out of poverty by self-sustainable improvements.
  - All OIC programs fall under 4 focus areas: community services, nutritional and health services, education and career services, housing and financial services.
  - OIC works on addressing program service gaps in the geographical area and within their services competencies.
